OBEY NO MATTER WHAT

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Hey there! In yesterday's study, God, the Solution-Solver, showed the Jews their real problem by pointing out their symptoms. It sure made me think about the symptoms in my life that I need to consider. I hope you're doing the same.

Let's ask God to turn all those symptoms into mini-GPS units that lead us to the real problem. Rarely is the problem *out there*. Usually the problem is in *here* – in our hearts, in our choices, and in our priorities.

The people could have thought their real problem was that their houses needed paneling or that their crops needed fertilizer. They could have thought their real problem was that the new temple would be puny compared to the last one, so why bother?

But the real problem was disobedience. God's house still lay in ruins.

Read Haggai 1:10-11

Describe the price of the people's disobedience:

Now, contrast that disobedience with the blessings of obedience found in **Deuteronomy 7:12-14**.

Describe what God promised:

This passage has a direct connection between obedience and blessing. Growth, prosperity, and fertility were all direct results of obedience. Death, poverty, and futility were results of disobedience. When we're obedient, we experience ______ and ______; we live in ______. When we're disobedient, hope and peace die a slow death. We find ourselves in _______, and our best efforts end in futility.

Ultimately, our ______ pleases God and is for His glory. Like John Piper says, "God is most ______ in us when we are most ______ in Him." That means that even if you don't see a direct link between your obedience and God's blessings, you are most blessed because your soul is most satisfied.

But can we be honest here? Sometimes in my most honest and flawed self, I hope, think, expect, and wish that my obedience will not only glorify God, but will also help me out a little!

How about you? Do you sometimes obey God with selfish motivation, hoping for some physical rewards for your good behavior? Explain.

Pause here and pray about this. Prayerfully journal the answers to the following questions:

Does obedience guarantee blessing?

Is blessing contingent on obedience?

Can it be true obedience if my motives are selfish or my heart isn't in it?

Read Luke 6:46 and John 14:15.

"If you love me, keep my commands.
